


#### GREETING

For the Lord has comforted his people.




# GREETING (Continued)

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful.


And kindle in them the fire of your love.

Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created.






#### PRAYER

he loved me ere I knew him, and all my love is due him,


he plunged me to victory beneath the cleansing flood.

and some sweet day I'll sing up there the song of victory.



For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.




God sent his Son, they called him Jesus; he came to love, heal and forgive; he lived and died to buy my pardon, an empty grave is there to prove my Savior lives.


