SCRIPTURE LESSONS

Psalm 9:9-20 NRSV • ⁹ The LORD is a stronghold for the oppressed, a stronghold in times of trouble.¹⁰ And those who know your name put their trust in you, for you, O LORD, have not forsaken those who seek you. ¹¹ Sing praises to the LORD, who dwells in Zion. Declare his deeds among the peoples.¹² For he who avenges blood is mindful of them; he does not forget the cry of the afflicted. ¹³ Be gracious to me, O LORD. See what I suffer from those who hate me; you are the one who lifts me up from the gates of death, ¹⁴ so that I may recount all your praises, and, in the gates of daughter Zion, rejoice in your deliverance. ¹⁵ The nations have sunk in the pit that they made; in the net that they hid has their own foot been caught. ¹⁶ The LORD has made himself known, he has executed judgment; the wicked are snared in the work of their own hands. *Higgaion. Selah* ¹⁷ The wicked shall depart to Sheol, all the nations that forget God. ¹⁸ For the needy shall not always be forgotten, nor the hope of the poor perish forever. ¹⁹ Rise up, O LORD! Do not let mortals prevail; let the nations be judged before you. ²⁰ Put them in fear, O LORD; let the nations know that they are only human. *Selah*

Mark 4:35-41 NRSV• ³⁵ On that day, when evening had come, he said to them, “Let us go across to the other side.” ³⁶ And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. ³⁷ A great windstorm arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. ³⁸ But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, “Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?” ³⁹ He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, “Peace! Be still!” Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. ⁴⁰ He said to them, “Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?” ⁴¹ And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, “Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?”
